There is ample space to locate Three Captains second hoist on the north side of the fish buyers building away from the high traffic eighteen-wheeler semi-trailer truck loading area proposed in the CDP application. The north side of the fish buyer building is the exact location that Three Captains has had two hoists for over 30 years per their lease agreement with the Harbor District.

The hoist location proposed in the CDP application will block access to the work dock located directly below it. Blocking access will have negative consequences on the commercial fishing fleet and boaters who must repair their vessels. There is no commercial boat haul out facility in San Mateo County. For this reason access to the work dock is of vital importance to the fishing industry and the boating community.
